1. Destination: Heaven

- "Strive to enter through the narrow gate, for many, I tell you, will attempt to enter but will not be strong enough" Luke 13:22-30
- "I do not know where you are from. Depart from me, all you evildoers!" Luke 13:22-30
- Our Lady of Fatima
- "What we need to develop is a sort of gut reaction to the destructive power of sin. We need to feel revulsion for what it does to us. For this reaction to become operative in our soul, we need to see sin as it truly is, in all its ugliness." Fr. Paul Pearson
- Mary's request to Lucia at Fatima: Pray the Rosary daily and say this prayer at the end of each mystery: "O my Jesus, forgive us our sins, save us from the fire of hell. Lead all souls to heaven, especially those who are most in need of thy mercy."
- Analogy: Praying is Hugging the Father
 - O Hugging the Father. Should my hand go here or here? Should I lay my face towards His neck or away? Should I lean in, but then how far? What if I am thinking of dinner prep during the hug? Will He be irritated? Did I lay out the hamburger? Dang it. How can I make it the most perfect hug every single time I hug Him?
 - o God just wants your hug (aka: prayer). You place your hands, your feet, your hands wherever. Just don't allow the worrying about the "quality" of the hug... prevent you from reaching up.

2. Journey: The struggle on the narrow road . . . Sin.

- "God created us without us: but he did not will to save us without us." St. Augustine
- "Sin is an offense against reason, truth, and right conscience; it is failure in genuine love for God and neighbor caused by a perverse attachment to certain goods" (Catechism of the Catholic Church #1849)
- "Think of what is above, not of what is on earth. For you have died, and your life is hidden with Christ in God. When Christ your life appears, then you too will appear with Him in glory. Put to death, then, the parts of you that are earthly; immorality, impurity, passion, evil desire, and the greed that is idolatry." Colossians 3: 2-5
- What do we do when a sinful thought occurs to us?

- As soon as the evil one introduces a sinful thought or fear or lie into your head . . . recognize it.
- o Do not entertain it or allow any root to pierce your mind or soul.
 - "It is when we notice the dirt that God is most present in us; it is the very sign of His presence." C.S. Lewis
- Speak out loud:
 - "In the Name of Jesus . . . I renounce the spirit of pride. In the Name of Jesus . . . I renounce the spirit of unworthiness. In the Name of Jesus . . . I renounce the spirit of perfectionism. In the Name of Jesus . . . I renounce the lie that God is not with me. Closing: In the Name of Jesus I break every spirit and any related spirits that I have renounced and I command them to go right now. I thank you and praise you God for your glorious design of me. I ask your blessing upon me."
- Gardening is continual. Weeds will continue to grow. You cannot get full Sun (Son) and full
 growth unless you continually weed your garden. Weeding consists of renouncing spirits and lies,
 recognizing our sins and asking for forgiveness, and getting to confession regularly.
